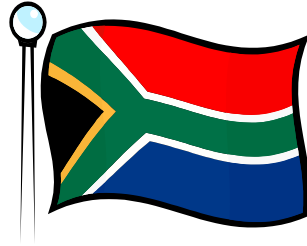


GIRL GUIDES FROM KZN INLAND SOUTH AFRICA

South Africa is divided into different regions, among them Kwa-Zulu Natal Inland which is my home region. The other regions are Coastal, Northern and Southern. The Girl Guide movement in South Africa is divided into various categories. Teddies is the starting point and allows girls from the ages of 5 – 7 to take part, gaining badges and learning the basics. Brownies is the next step, after Teddies you can become a Brownie until the age of 13. The Brownie uniform is a white shirt, brown skirt with brown pinafore straps where there Golden hand and Silver hand (the highest award you can get in Brownies) is sowed on. Collective badges may also be achieved. Branching out into more outdoor adventures then leads to Girl Guides. The Chiefs Challenge Award is the highest award you can achieve in Guiding. The Guide uniform is a blue skirt, worn with a white shirt and a blue sash. Collective badges are sown onto the sash. Rangers is the highest level of Guiding you can reach and represented by the Protea Award. Rangers uniforms consist of a navy blue skirt and a white shirt, with a tab worn on the left above the pocket showing various achievements.

Girl Guides in South Africa take every opportunity to enjoy camping, hiking, rafting and outdoors. We have lovely weather most of the year allowing us to fill full these activities. On our camps we have various activities consisting of crafts, outdoors survival, learning knots, constructing camping equipment, compass tracking and much more. Different camps are held through out the year. Some of the more common camps are raft race and Jotta. Over a period of a few years we have camps held in Cape Town where girl guides and scouts from all over South Africa come together. Poseidon is the water adventure and Cederberg is the mountain adventure which takes place in the Cederberg mountain.

FOOD:	COCONUT ICE	
	4 x 250ml sugar 250ml milk 250ml coconut 5ml margarine Red/pink food colouring	Melt the sugar and milk until it dissolves. Boil for 7 minutes until a soft ball forms. Take it off the heat and add to the coconut and margarine mixture. Halve the mixture and colour one half red and leave the rest white. Layer the mixture in a greased container and allow to cool. Cut into squares.
GAME:	LORD AND LADY BADEN-POWELL PUZZLE	
	Using information (how guiding/scouting started, dates, names, places and facts) create a story. Print the story out onto a sheet of paper and then paste onto a hard piece of card. Using a template of a puzzle, draw onto the card forming the shapes of puzzle pieces. Cut the pieces out and use it as a great puzzle game.	
ACITIVITY:	SOUTH AFRICAN BEADED BADGE	
	Blue, yellow, red, black, green, and white beads 1 large safety pin Lots of medium safety pins	Using the pattern of the South African flag construct the pattern on the medium safety pins. Once enough pins have been filled, take the large safety pin and open the loop at the end up. Thread on the beaded safety pins and re-close the loop. You can wear the beaded badge or give it away as a gift.
